Safety or Quality of Life	The repairs that are requested should improve the safety, health, livability, durability or environmental comfort of the home.			
Evidence Of Need and Low Income Qualification	 Must be current on mortgage Currently live in housing that is in need of repair (i.e. painting, exterior renovations, roofing repairs, water damage, safety needs such as wheelchair ramp, hand rails) Be unable to perform the repairs themselves Document inability to pay a contractor to do the repairs The total household income must fall within the levels listed in this chart (starting 3/2013):

Willingness to Partner with Habitat for Humanity	The homeowner will cooperate with Habitat for Humanity staff and volunteers who will be completing repairs on the home. Homeowners are expected to assist with the repair work, to the extent of their abilities, at approximately 1 hour for each \$150 spent on materials.			
Ability to Pay for Repair Materials	Habitat for Humanity provides the homeowner with an estimate of the cost of materials, the administrative fee and the down payment. The homeowner signs a promissory note to pay for the materials required to complete the home repairs, and an administrative fee. Homeowners are not expected to pay for all materials in advance. Following a down payment (15% of the cost of materials), Habitat may allow the homeowner to make payments, for up to two years.
